What the heck is that?

Well, it's an unofficial RHYC cruise around the southwest end of Vancouver Island northbound to Barkley Sound and beyond.

When are the Loonie-Toons doing THAT trip?

Dunno. Still too early to tell. Earliest seems to be right after Memorial Day. Latest seems to be sometime in late July or early August.

When are the Toons coming home?

Dunno that either. Minimum time for such a venture is around two (2) to three (3) weeks. Maximum duration can be as long as you can get away with. Heck, I may never come home!

Who's going?

Anybody that qualifies as a Toon, with or without a boat that floats. Some under power, some praying for wind so they can sail. That pretty much means anybody that wants to come along! There are plans afloat for some of us to head north around with the big boats (berths available), some to drive over the top of Vancouver Island (seats available), some towing small fishing boats, and all to meet up with the afloat group on the west side.

Who's leading this goat-rope?

Nobody. This is very definitely a do-it-yourself trip. Why would one go west-around Vancouver Island?

Because we can! The longest open water passage is approximately 90nm from Victoria to Ucluelet. From there on, it's protected, flat water similar to the Inside Passage to AK. Once around, that puts you into Barkley Sound, with at least a bozillion islands to explore, and easy access for shore-side passengers and accommodations at Ucluelet. Sights to see in Barkley Sound include the Steam Train out of Port Alberni up to a steam powered sawmill in the mountains. The Broken Islands. Salmon. Halibut.

Where else will the Boogie go?

Anywhere it pleases! Tofino, Clayoquot Sound, Hot Springs Cove, Nootka Sound, etc. You tell me!

Where will the land-based group settle?

Again, anywhere they want too! There are plenty of B&Bs near Ucleulet and Tofino, lots of motels, some fancy-pants homes for rent, whatever. Once we settle on a schedule and itinerary, everybody's on their own for reservations.
