
### **Upcoming events are:**

## **Couscous with Apricots and Almonds**

serves 4 - 6

- 1 c. couscous
- 3/4 c. water
- 3/4 c. chicken stock/broth (low sodium)
- 10 dried apricots, chopped
- 1/3 c. slivered almonds, toasted
- 2 T. lemon juice
- 3 green onions, chopped
- 1/3 C. chopped parsley
- 2 T. olive oil
- 2 T. butter
- salt to taste

In a pot, bring water and stock to a boil. Place couscous in a heat-proof medium bowl; pour boiling water over it and stir with a fork to combine. Cover and let stand for 10 to 15 minutes, then uncover and fluff with a fork. In a large bowl, mix apricots, almonds, lemon juice, green onions, parsley. Add couscous, olive oil, butter and salt to taste. Toss gently to combine.


## **Carthaginian Flank Steak (North African)**

Marinade for one 2 pound flank:

- 1 cup onion chopped
- 2 T. garlic diced
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1/2 cup lemon juice
- 3 Tablespoons soy sauce
- 2 Tablespoons dry sherry
- 1/4 cup fresh oregano ( or 2 Tablespoons dried oregano)
- 2 teaspoons chili sauce with garlic (found in Asian section of grocery store)
- 1 teaspoon turmeric
- Salt and pepper



